Ideas & Details

- Look what the author chose to do with his idea.
- Look closely at this illustration. What kinds of details are included?

Organization

- What do you notice about how this book is organized?
- What happens at the end of this story? Did the ending surprise you or did the author give you clues along the way?
- How did the author begin the story? What happens in the middle of the story? How did the author choose to end the story?
- Is this the end of the story? Why or why not?
- What do you think will happen next? Why do you think that?

Word Choice

- Close your eyes and put a picture in your mind while I read this sentence again. Doesn't the author do a wonderful job of painting a picture with words? Are there some words in this sentence that you especially like?
- Listen to the words the author chose to use right here.
- The author used these words; what words might you use?
- Notice how the author used the word ______ instead of ______.
 (e.g., shrieked instead of said, huge instead of big)

Voice

- Can't you just hear the character talking?
- How does this character feel right now? How does the author help you know that?
- How does the author want you to feel right now? How do you know?

Fluency

- Listen to this sentence again. Doesn't it sound wonderful?
- Read this sentence with me. Hear how it flows as you say it.
- Notice how some of the sentences are long and stretchy while some are very short.

Conventions

- Look at this end mark. What does that tell us about how the author wants us to read this sentence?
- This word starts with a capital letter. Why is that?
- Look at these marks. They're called quotation marks. The author used them to show us that someone is talking. Who's talking right here?


